



planning out other steps!




The Essay

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story. [No change]
- 2. The lessons we take from *obstacles we encounter* can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a *challenge*, *setback*, *or failure*. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience? [Revised]
- 3. Reflect on a time when you *questioned* or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your *thinking*? What *was the outcome*? [Revised]
- 4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution. [No change]
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or *realization* that *sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.* [Revised]
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more? [New]
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design. [New]

Sources of Financial Aid



More than \$183.8 billion in financial aid was available to undergraduates in 2016-17. Financial aid comes from many sources:

- Federal government grants, loans and other aid: 67%
- College grants/ scholarships: 22%
- Private and employer grants/scholarships: 6%
- State government grants/scholarships:

What if my senior is undecided?

- A GAP year?
 - Savings on college tuition, loans, etc.
 - Internship or job exploration with a plan
 - 72% of American workforce is disengaged from their jobs ('A Parent's Guide to the Gap Year) → a planful Gap year
 - Mark Lindquist (Ted Talk): "the most uniformed decision we'll ever make is where we're forced to choose our college major"
- The "more doors open" concept: apply to a 'backup' now and decide later in the spring
- Employment
- Military
- Trade related training (e.g. New England Tech, Lincoln Institute, etc.) – benefit of student "seeing" a trade
